I feel blessed to have attended a Christian college and seminary that prepared me well for much of what I have needed in ministry. I graduated well-trained in theology, preaching, pastoral ministry, etc.

However, most schools — including the college and seminary I attended — cannot provide specialized training for every kind of ministry. And so I graduated without any town and country ministry training.

Couple this with my city and megachurch background, and a recipe for cultural collision was in the making when following graduation I began a pastorate in a small, country church. People in my new community didn't think like me. The church's approach to ministry was different from anything I had previously encountered. I soon discovered that much of the methodology I was familiar with just wasn't going to work, but I didn't have a clue as to what to do. I felt lonely and discouraged — like an alien in a foreign land.

Many pastors in this kind of situation do not last longer than a year in their first church. They leave feeling like failures. Yet, it does not need to be this way.
